Children's Public Health Service

The service supports parents and carers to give babies, children and young people the best possible start in life. We will provide a series of 10 health checks starting with an antenatal contact, and you will be given advice and support about your child's development and growth, healthy eating, physical activity, emotional wellbeing and immunisations.

We'll support you to become confident in looking after the health and development needs of your child from when they are born to when they transition into adulthood. We will also provide support to children and young people as they grow and develop, offering information and advice as and when needed.

Bexley 5 to 10

Getting ready for starting school

Our Health Visitors will support you in getting your child ready for primary school. They will provide guidance on arranging pre-school immunisations and advice about healthy eating, toileting, hand washing, etc. At five years your child moves to the care of our Public Health School Nurses.



Public Health School Nurses

Public Health School Nurses are qualified Nurses or Midwives who have completed further training. School Staff Nurses are qualified nurses who work with the Public Health School Nurses to support children and young people with their health needs.

Every school has a named nurse who provides advice to children about healthy living and supports them in their choices. They are approachable and non-judgemental and their aim is to enable children and young people to improve their health and wellbeing and reach their full potential.

Primary School

The School Nursing team will complete the following checks, during which they will also review appropriate interventions for any physical, emotional or developmental problems that may have been missed or not addressed. Parental consent will always be obtained in advance.

Height and Weight Measurements

In Reception and Year 6, your child's height and weight will be measured by the School Nursing team in line with the National Child Measurement Programme to assess whether they are the most suitable weight for their height.

Eyesight and Hearing Checks

When in Reception the School Nursing team will also check your child's eyesight and hearing. The School Nursing team will inform you of the results, along with further information on who to contact, if appropriate.

Bexley 11 to 19

Secondary school/college

The Public Health School Nurse is available to speak to young people on a range of health topics and is responsible for general health promotion. Support and guidance will be offered on topics such as relationships, contraception and mental wellbeing.



Year 7

Your child will be asked to complete a confidential, online questionnaire that covers a range of topics, including healthy eating, body image, emotional wellbeing, healthy relationships, bullying and road safety.

The School Nurse will assess which topics the children are most concerned about and offer group work to provide appropriate advice and information.

Year 11

Your child will be given an information pack with further advice and information about some of the topics covered when they were in Year 7, plus others such as sexual health, alcohol and substance misuse, and registering with a GP and dentist.
